Just a note of congratulations to the Year 11 pupils who are currently completing their GCSE examinations. We are about two thirds of the ways through and the conduct and attitude of the pupils has been exemplary. These are very stressful times and keeping a calm perspective, getting plenty of sleep and keeping energy levels high remains very important.

They are of course the first year group that is experiencing the brand new and more challenging Mathematics and English GCSE examinations where the awarded grades will be from 1 to 9, where 9 is the highest grade (well above a previous A* grade). All other subjects are still be using the traditional grades of G to A*.

Whenever such changes take place there is a significant period of settling down to go through which means that it is simply not possible to make reasoned comparisons between this year's results and previous ones. However the work rate and attendance at the countless additional lessons suggest the signs are very positive for our pupils and we both hope and pray that they will enjoy great success in August.

YEAR 7 CRICKET TOURNAMENT

The Year 7 team played their first games together in the group stage of the Preston Schools' Cricket Competition. The group games were played on Tuesday, 13 June at Our Lady's on a well prepared wicket. Conditions were good and the team were excited to play together. Their first game was against Fulwood Acadmey and we were put in to bat first by our opponents. We managed to hit 48 in our 8 overs and restricted Fulwood to only 33 to win the game by 15 runs. Our second game was much closer against Ashton High School. Our opponents opted to bat first and our bowling was excellent with Kieran Carpenter and Daniel Green bowling good line and length, preventing Ashton from scoring many runs, ending with 24, a particularly low score. Ashton responded with excellent bowling and made it difficult for our batsmen to score and in the end we could not reach their target and finished on 21, losing to Ashton by 3 runs. In our final game against Moor Park we both batted and bowled well, allowing us to win quite comfortably. We came second in the group overall, just behind Ashton who progress as group winners. The team were pleased with their performance and look forward to other games.
