HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME

<u>INFORMATION FROM LCC ABOUT HOME TO SCHOOL TRANSPORT</u>

September 2015: The County Council removed further discretionary elements of the previous policy. All new pupils starting at school will only be paid transport assistance if they attend their nearest school and live more than three miles away. When undertaking assessments there is no longer any consideration of which Geographical Priority Area a pupil lives within and schools in neighbouring districts and local authorities are also considered.

Denominational transport assistance is still available but only where a pupil is attending their nearest faith school and the parental contribution is paid. In determining the nearest faith school for denominational transport assistance the County Council no longer considers whether a particular school serves a parish in which the pupil lives.
