KS3 PUPILS RECEIVE 3B4ME CERTIFICATES IN DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

The Design Technology department introduced a new initiative with all Year 7+8 pupils this year called '3b4Me'. The concept was to improve Teaching & Learning by identifying pupil (3b4Me) mentors who have shown an ability to:

- Complete a task quickly.
- Complete a task to a high standard.
- Work independently.
- Communicate with others' effectively.

As a result successful *3b4Me* mentors received from their Design Technology teachers:



- A green stamp for each lesson.
- Reward points at the end of each project.

Pupils who had been nominated by <u>all</u> of their DT teachers throughout the year received an 'Advanced' *3b4Me* Certificate and a prize, whilst pupils who had been nominated by at least 3 of their DT teachers received a 'Basic' *3b4Me* Certificate. Mrs Smith, Principal Teacher of Design Technology awarded the certificates to pupils in. A total of 22 Yr7 and Yr8 pupils received certificates with 3 pupils gaining the 'Advanced' level. This is a prestigious achievement so well done to all who received certificates! This is something we intend to continue in 2016-17 so watch this space for further updates.

ADMISSIONS

The process of applying for high school places in September 2016 has now begun for Year 6 pupils. Parents wishing to choose Our Lady's should apply online at www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools or via the link on Moodle. Parents should ensure that preferences are selected in the correct order as Lancashire County Council always aim to offer places in order of preference. Please be aware that it is necessary to apply even if a brother or sister is already at Our Lady's and it is imperative that all applications are received **before the deadline of 31**October 2016. In addition to the Lancashire application process we ask that a Supplementary Form is completed. These forms are available on the school website or from reception.
