DIOCESAN INSPECTION OF THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL

GCSE ART EXAM 2018 (Year 11)

All pupils have been given their GCSE Art exam paper this week. Pupils will be working on preparatory work on their chosen exam theme over the following weeks. Pupils should produce as much of their best quality preparatory work (this consists of drawings, research and photography) as they can in class and <u>at home</u>. They can also download the PixIR autodesk App (free on mobiles/tablets/PC!) to edit photos – this scores lots of marks! There are other Apps which may be pertinent to their exam theme – PhotoshopMix, Pic Collage, Color Effects and more besides.

The controlled 10 hour final piece will be completed during school time. The exam project contributes to 40% of the final GCSE mark and will be completed on the second session of the 10 hour exam. Please encourage your child to work hard at home and make use of the extra sessions offered in school: Mon-Fri lunch. Mon, Wed, Fri after school (week A and B) and Tues (week B) after school. For further information/exam planning/guide to annotating work/copies of the exam paper and the OLCHS help sheet are on Moodle (GCSE Art and Design).

Sketchbooks/preparation work must be handed in on the first session of the 10 hour exam – failure to comply with this exam regulation will result in withdrawal from the GCSE exam. Dates for the exam final piece are as follows:

GUIDE DOG PUPPY VISIT

Last year we raised £1500 to sponsor a Guide Dog puppy. Our puppy was named Pepper, by Kieran Carpenter in 8U. Pepper is a black Labrador-Retriever and is now 7 months old. He has been training to be a Guide Dog for 5 months now and came into school last week to visit some of our Year 7 and Year 9 pupils. We learnt about how Guide Dog puppies are trained to provide support and care for people who are visually-impaired. The staff responsible for Pepper's training sent the following: "Just a short note to thank you for your hospitality today during Pepper's visit. You never really know what to expect taking a young pup into a new environment but Pepper took it all in his stride and was a credit to his puppy walkers. The children were attentive and asked sensible questions (which isn't always the case) and I think they learned a lot from Gordon's talk"
