WORLD BOOK DAY

World Book day/week was celebrated at Our Lady's with an array of activities: On the day, pupils and staff dressed up as their favourite book characters, competing for prizes. Classroom and office doors were decorated very imaginatively. Year 8 and some Year 7 classes were treated to a visit from the renowned author Frank Cottrell Boyce who entertained them with readings from his books and stories about how he came to write them. In addition, a story was read at the start of lessons throughout the day: Years 7, 8 and 9 heard 'Only 5 Minutes', and Years 9 and 10, 'Death by Scrabble', which they thoroughly enjoyed. A quiz on the stories took place in form the following day. Pupils have also been voting for their favourite library book in the LRC all week and the result will be announced when the votes have been counted.

They played some great football in the first half, having more of the possession and creating a number of scoring opportunities. However, Longridge pulled a goal back. Our Lady's had an instant chance to respond when they were awarded a penalty. However, the goalkeeper saved it and it remained 1-1 at half time. The second half continued in the same vein with Our Lady's dominating possession and creating chances but it felt like it was just not going to be their day. Longridge scored another two goals, both of which were against the run of play. Our Lady's hit the bar twice and missed a number of great chances.
