There were three boys competing as individuals as well as a team and three girls following the same format. Each pupil had to perform three climbs and three boulders. Out of a total of 11 teams that entered, the girls team finished in a very respectable 5th place. The boys clinched 2nd place from Broughton in an exciting three-way speed climb. Both schools finished on equal points, narrowly losing out to Fulwood Academy in 1st place. A huge congratulations goes to John Dickinson who, out of all the male climbers, came first place in the individual event. It was a great day and a fantastic competition. RUGBY UPDATE

On Thursday, 6 December, the Year 8 rugby team travelled to Preston Grasshoppers to take part in another set of rugby fixtures. The all made huge improvements which was fantastic to see. In their first game, they beat Broughton comfortably winning by three tries. Despite the win, the team looked one dimensional and they were collectively advised to think about the 'bigger picture'. In their second game against Ashton, they were attempting to act on the feedback given which was great to see. Unfortunately, they were passing in dangerous areas and were putting themselves under pressure. Nevertheless, they defended bravely and tackled the large Ashton team with courage and determination. It was a very close game but in the last few minutes, two fantastic solo tries from Marcin Wojtowicz resulted in a two try victory. Their third and final game saw them come up against a very strong and powerful Archbishop Temple side. They had a number of quick players which caused Our Lady's a lot of damage. They lost by four tries in their final game but after the game, they were all happy at how much they had improved as individuals and as a team which, in turn, improved their results on the night. BASKETBALL NEWS

The U14 Basketball team began their Lancashire Cup campaign away against Garstang Academy on Monday, 3 December and it proved to be a difficult start. The Our Lady's team was a mixture of Years 7, 8 and 9 pupils who had not played collectively as a team before. It took time for partnerships to form therefore we were making a few unforced errors early in the game. Garstang were physically strong opponents and clearly played regularly together so began to take a comfortable lead. Our Lady's struggled to get close to the basket however Leo Fletcher worked tirelessly and was rewarded for his efforts scoring a fantastic 3pt shot from distance, followed by a brilliant hook shot. All other players did their best but it was not enough to catch Garstang, the final score being 46-10 to the hosts.

The U16 team travelled to Corpus Christi High School on Thursday, 6 December and played a very close game. Through each of the first 2 quarters the scores were within one basket of each other. In the third quarter Corpus began to stretch a lead after some unforced errors from Our Lady's. This meant that 10 points were needed to tie the game in the final quarter. It ended up being just too much to chase and the team lost 32-22. Excellent performances from Liam Burns and Ed Cafferkey were recognised by both coaches and now the team can look forward to their next opponents a week today.
