BASKETBALL RESULTS

Three year groups played basketball matches on Wednesday, 9 January in various competitions. The Year 7 team played their first game for Our Lady's against Tarleton Academy in the Lancashire Cup. Both teams began very timidly, getting used to the flow of a real game. Tarleton struck first, using accurate passing to move the ball around the court to find shooting space. They continued to add to their tally while Our Lady's slowly started to find their feet. Liam McCaul's composure earned him two baskets throughout the match but the rest of the team could not add to the total. Tarleton left as winners with the score finishing 17-4 but there was plenty of learning done by the Our Lady's team.

The Year 8 team travelled to Longridge High School to begin a small tournament with other schools from Preston, guided by the coaching skills of Miss Lewis. The team played their first game against Corpus Christi and narrowly missed out on victory with the score finishing 12-10 to our opponents. In the second game against Broughton the team were much more effective in attack, scoring 12 while only conceding 8, showing improvements in defence also. The top scorers' prize was shared between Ethan Dalton and Tiernan Hayes. The team play a further two games next Wednesday.

The U16 team played their final game of the season against an unbeaten Tarleton Academy who were Lancashire champions last year. This game was to be the most exciting game to be played by an Our Lady's team over the past decade. The first 3 quarters of the game were dominated by Our Lady's. Every pass was made with conviction and every shot seemed to score. Liam Burns worked with exceptional levels of intensity to drive towards the basket while sprinting into defence to win the ball back. Ed Cafferkey's rebounding skills were outstanding, regaining possession and calmly supporting the next attack. James Lupton found space behind the line of defence to score basket after basket and the team were playing with exceptional enthusiasm. They knew it would be tough to keep up the pressure on their opponents as they were aware of the skill level Tarleton possessed. By the final quarter Our Lady's were up by 4 points and holding onto their lead. Two free throws by Tarleton made the scores even and the clock was ticking down. The umpires counted down the final 10 seconds and it looked to be going to overtime, only for Tarleton to score a final basket on the buzzer, taking the win 23-21. The Our Lady's team were devastated but both teachers complimented them on their progress from last year. The effort levels, manners and sportsmanship throughout the game were outstanding. Regardless of the loss, it still looks like the team will progress into the knockout stages. Here's hoping they keep the momentum of this game going into the next one.
