Too many wides were given away and soon enough our opposition only needed a few more runs to beat our total. Liam McCaul came on to bowl and quickly took the wicket of the captain which raised the spirits of the team, taking his bails off with an accurate delivery. Chorlton made the remaining runs and won the game with 9 wickets remaining. Our Lady's were disappointed not to win but will have learned some valuable lessons about minimising fielding errors and batting with more purpose for their next games 2 weeks.
