GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

Over the past week all 99 of our G.C.S.E Geography students have visited a number of sites along the River Wyre as part of their Unit 3 Physical fieldwork topic. The students investigated if the River Wyre matched the Bradshaw model. They worked in small groups to conduct experiments to see the the changes to the width, depth, velocity, gradient and bed load shape. These findings will be presented, analysed and evaluated back in class. We also looked visited Garstang to look at the hard and soft management methods which have been put in place to manage the risk of flooding.

CRICKET RESULTS

Both the Year 8 and Year 9 team had games this week with Year 8 playing against Broughton on Wednesday, 19 June and Year 9 against Eden Boys' School on Thursday, 20 June. Although both results did not go our way there was some excellent cricket played by each year group. The familiar trend between each age group was their shot selection when batting. Many top end batsmen were selecting risky shots against accurate bowling which was all too often resulting in being bowled out. Max Smith was the stand out performance of the week, captaining the Year 8 team in the absence of Adam Ball and hitting a delightful 28 runs before retiring. His quick thinking allowed him to pick up single runs from defensive shots while he punished less accurate bowling, hitting 5 boundaries. Alfie Campbell, also of Year 8, bowled exceptionally well, keeping a good line and length and putting pressure on the opposition's batsmen. The Year 9 team struggled against a good Eden Boys' School, eventually losing by 50 runs, unable to reach the high total of 101 set by Eden in their innings. The strength in depth from the opponents was a little too much for the middle and tail end batsmen from Our Lady's and our wickets fell quite quickly. Both teams enjoyed themselves but we're disappointed with their losses but now look forward to next week's fixtures.
