DUKE OF EDINBURGH BRONZE ASSESSMENT

On Thursday, 12 September everybody taking part brought their bags to school and attended a Kit Inspection, either at Lunchtime or after the school day had ended. We were each assigned our kit for the next day or the day after, we were given things like: Trangia Stoves, Tents, Rucksacks, and more!

The Friday group began their assessment from the Visitor Centre at Beacon Fell, the first task was to navigate to the top of Beacon Fell and walk back down it. The groups then headed North up to Bleasdale School and Church and discovered the Bleasdale Stone Circle. After a break they headed back on their journey and up a hill before heading South on the final stretch of our journey. Finally, the third task was to Navigate to a Farmyard that had a sign directing them to the Cobble Hey Farm where camp was for the night.

After a good rest, Mr Thompson woke up the groups at 6.45 am. This route consisted of a 10 - 12km circular path and consisted of a series of farm fields and country roads to start and then dropped down next to the Winsnape Brock. This was arguably the hardest part of the route for some pupils as they had to walk up a large hill and then cross what many people were calling a 'slip and slide' – a very large patch of slippy ground.

The change over of groups took place on Saturday lunchtime with the second set of groups walking the reverse of the first groups.

Weather conditions were perfect, and 80 Year 10 pupils successfully completed the Assessment Weekend and will be presented with their Bronze Award in December.
