YEAR 8 FOOTBALL NEWS

The Year 8 football team played their fourth game of the season against Fulwood Academy on Monday, 14 October. The game was very end to end throughout. Our Lady's started well and took an early lead with an excellent goal from Joel Craig. However, the home team quickly got a hold of the game. Their midfielders dominated possession and dictated play. It was 3-1 to Fulwood at half-time but it could have been more. The second half continued in the same vein. Our Lady's scored an early goal to get themselves back into the game. But unfortunately, the home side attacked in numbers and were by far the better team. Fulwood were strong opponents throughout. They committed a lot of players going forward and always looked a threat. The final score ended 7-3 to the hosts. Well done to all involved.

YEAR 10 FOOTBALL RESULTS

The Year 10 team played their first two league games of the year over the past week and were extremely successful in both, winning by considerable margins. Their first game was against Corpus Christi on Friday, 11 October. This same fixture last year resulted in a 5-4 loss for Our Lady's and so the team were looking to bounce back. YEAR 11 FOOTBALL NEWS

Unfortunately, the Year 11 football team suffered their first defeat of the season. They played Ashton Science and Community College on Friday, 11 October away from home. Well played to Ashton; they thoroughly deserved the victory.

BIATHLON SUCCESS

William Murray 8U and Lucy Beesley 7O both competed in the qualifying rounds for the National Biathlon Championships on Sunday, 13 October in York. William and Lucy had to complete a distance run and a swim in the pool in as fast a time as possible to gain enough points to qualify for the championships. William scored 2023 points overall which ensured his place in the national championships in Nottingham in November while Lucy fell agonisingly short of the 2000 point qualification mark. Both pupils are looking forward to taking part British Schools' Championships in March.

YEAR 7 MATHS CHALLENGE

Sometimes we need to pause and think of things we take for granted, such as access to drinking water. Wellgood.org is a sponsored scheme where businesses will reward pupils for answering Maths questions. They will fund the installation of wells for our neighbours around the world. 10 points or more are awarded for each question correctly answered. **100 points or 10 questions provides drinking water for 1 person for 1 day.** From Monday, 14 October through to the end of Year 7 there will be an inter form monthly competition and an individual monthly competition. The website is well-good.org. Pupils select the school, year and their username is surname and first initial eg brownj. The password has been given to pupils in form time this week. The competition is accessible for all pupils. The target topic for October is "times tables". Over half term please encourage pupils to take part.

The process of applying for high school places in September 2020 has now begun for Year 6 pupils. Parents wishing to choose Our Lady's should apply online at https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/ or via the link on Moodle. Parents should ensure that preferences are selected in the correct order as Lancashire County Council always aim to offer places in order of preference. Please be aware that it is necessary to apply even if a brother or sister is already at Our Lady's and it is imperative that all applications are received **before the deadline of 31 October 2019.** In addition to the Lancashire application process we ask that a Supplementary Form is completed if you wish to be considered on faith grounds. These forms are available on the school website or from reception and should be returned to school by 31 October 2019.
