ENRICHMENT DAY 1

Year 7 experienced a wide range of activities based on the theme of 'Social,' including creating a form flag; building a campfire; learning about the advantages and disadvantages of social media; and orienteering. Within each of the sessions, pupils developed their social skills and the ability to utilise these in a variety of different social situations. Pupils worked incredibly well in their teams and developed their bonds even further within their form groups.

Year 8 successfully dodged the rain to reach the top of Rivington Pike. En route we looked out for examples of the flora and fauna, whilst learning about the historical importance of follies. The day was completed with a creative activity around the Countryside Code: Respect, Protect, Enjoy. A good day was had by all.

Year 9 travelled to The Crocky Trail in Chester. Pupils participated in 3 different activities. Forms O, U and R started on the Crocky Trail which involved 10 different team building activities where pupils had to help each other to cross bridges, wobbly ropes and find their way through mazes. Forms L, A and D spent an hour on the different mechanical rides. There were also team-based activities which required determination and courage. Finally, pupils helped clear the site of litter to ensure the local wildlife were kept safe. It was a day full of smiles and mud. We all had a fantastic day.

Year 10 pupils experienced a series of workshops including:

- "The Windrush Project "an appreciation of how cultural influences have shaped our own heritage.
- Drama workshop around the story of Rosa Parks and how her small gesture has had a ripple effect on society today.
- A Caribbean steel drumming session with a guest artist.
- The British democratic system and its central role in shaping our history and values in continuing to develop Britain.
- An exploration and understanding of different faiths.
- The cultural influence of digital devices.

The aim of the day was to broaden pupils' awareness of different cultures in the world and how they have impacted upon our culture over the years to make us the people we are today. Pupils participated with great enthusiasm.

Year 11 had an Enrichment Day based around the theme of volunteering. The aim was to explore the benefits and importance of volunteering through various tasks and external presentations. The students received three presentations from external providers. Speakers from the NCS, Barnardo's and Lancashire MIND came in to give an

insight into how volunteers play a crucial role in their respective causes. They also promoted the personal and career benefits of undertaking volunteering roles. This was supplemented by classroom tasks looking at the importance of volunteering when communities face natural disasters in the current climate or experience times of conflict through historical events such as World War I. It was a fantastic day. The students were very respectful and well-behaved throughout. This is supported through wonderful feedback from the NCS speakers who said:

"We got 107 expression of interest forms back which is great. I think it's the most we've ever had back from a school after the assembly. The students were a credit to the school too, asking some really good questions when going around the forms".
