SCHOOL OF SANCTUARY

On Thursday, 30 January Mrs Robinson, Mrs Howard and 4 pupils were invited to receive the 'School of Sanctuary Award' on behalf of our school at County Hall in Preston. We are the first secondary school in Preston to receive the award and only the second in Lancashire. The pupils presented to other schools and members of the community about what activities our school community have been involved with as part of this award. A School of Sanctuary is a school that helps its students, staff and wider community understand what it means to be seeking sanctuary and to extend a welcome to everyone as equal, valued members of the school community. It is a school that is proud to be a place of safety and inclusion for all.

GCSE ART EXAM 2020 (Year 11)

All Year 11 GCSE Art pupils have now been given their exam paper. Pupils are currently working on preparatory work for their chosen exam theme over the following weeks in sketchbooks provided by the Art department. Pupils should produce as much of their best quality preparatory work (this consists of drawings, research and photography) as they can in class and at home. There is a weekly plan available on Google classroom, which clearly lays out the minimum work that pupils must complete in class and at home for each stage of their preparatory work (pupils wishing to attain the higher GCSE grades, will want to maximize their chances by extending their developmental preparatory work as much as possible). The controlled 10 hour element will be completed during school time. The exam project contributes 40% to the final GCSE grade and will be fully completed on the second session of the 10 hour exam. Please encourage your child to work hard at home and make use of the extra sessions offered in school: Mon-Fri lunch. Mon (after school on request), Wed after school (week A and B) and Tues (week B) after school.
