Keeping in Touch Week

I really must commend families for their commitment to the structured tasks to support learning that our teachers are providing each day. The previous week we tried to make contact with every family in our school to ask individually about the welfare of our children. There remain some families where we have not been able to make such contact. If you know that you have not either spoken directly to your child's Form Tutor or Learning Manager or have not had direct email communication to share concerns, I very much urge you to make contact with school. The ongoing welfare of our pupils is of great concern to us and while we may not be able to solve all problems, talking them through is a good idea and we shall try to help where we can.

Over the past couple of years, we have covered the topic of online safety thoroughly both with our pupils and with you as parents through our parents evening sessions. With the current situation requiring our young people to spend an increased amount of time online in order to complete their schoolwork we thought it would be a good time to draw your attention to some of the key things to put in place at home in order to keep your child safe. Possible School Opening

You will have heard speculation about secondary schools opening for 'some meaningful contact with Y10 pupils only; not before Monday, 1 June'. The suggestion is that this could amount to, 'some time spent with teachers before the summer break'.

I met with governors last night and we do NOT believe that the current situation in terms of guidance on achievable safety is acceptable. Nothing will be placed before the safety of our pupils, our staff and all of their families. Hence school will NOT be opening for any Y10 pupils straight after the Half Term break. We are preparing plans for a phased opening to ONLY Y10 pupils later in the term. Such opening is highly likely to have very stringent conditions associated with social distancing of ALL people present both in school and on the way to and from school. We will keep you informed of all developments.
