The theme for next week is God's Trust in us. (Matthew 21: 33 - 43)

In this week's Gospel, Matthew uses the Parable of the Vineyard. The landowner leaves his tenants to live on the land and produce a good harvest in return. When he sends his servants to collect the harvest, they are attacked by the tenants. Finally, trusting that no harm will come, the landlord sends his own son. He is thrown out of the vineyard and killed. It is obvious that Jesus is the son in this story. God has put His trust in us. He has given us love, forgiveness, mercy and kindness. He trusts us to give the same to each other.

O my God,

Help me to love my neighbour as myself. I forgive all who have offended me and ask pardon of all whom I have offended. Amen.

KEEPING WARM

We approach winter and have the dilemma of following the instruction to keep rooms well ventilated and the need to also remain warm. In addition, it has always been our practice for pupils to spend break and lunchtime outside in the fresh air; COVID 19 restrictions actually encourage this practice. If your child feels the cold quite quickly you may wish to provide a vest type of garment for under their school shirt or blouse. Should this be the case then the garment must be white and no part of it should be visible around the collar or sleeves.

Please ensure that your child has both coat and a drawstring bag in which to store their coat safely. Please remember that coats must be rain and wind proof; be a dark colour; be without prominent writing or images. Hoodies, sweatshirts, track tops, fleeces, leather/partial leather, denim/partial denim coats are not appropriate for school. The coat, as with all uniform items, should have your child's name clearly written inside, as so many coats are identical.
