Teach us to speak the truth always. The truth will set us free. (John 8:32) Amen


RETURN TO SCHOOL - UNIFORM

RECIPE OF THE WEEK - CREAM OF BROCCOLI SOUP

Ingredients

1 medium onion

1 clove garlic

900 g raw broccoli, tough ends removed, stems and florets chopped

2 vegetable stock cubes dissolved in 600ml water

240 ml light evaporated milk

½ tsp hot pepper sauce (Tabasco)

1 tsp salt, 1 tsp black pepper

1 tsp chives, chopped

Method

- 1. Combine onion and garlic in a large saucepan with 60ml of water, simmer until soft, spoon into a large pot.
- 2. Dissolve stock cubes in 600ml of boiling water. Add broccoli and stock to pot; bring to a boil over high heat, reduce heat and simmer until broccoli is soft but still green, about 8 minutes. Do not cover while broccoli is cooking, or it will turn grey. Remove from heat; puree in a blender until smooth (be careful not to splatter hot liquid). Add evaporated milk and tabasco pepper sauce, season to taste with salt and pepper. Sprinkle 1 teaspoon of chopped chives over each serving, optional.
