# The 5th week of Lent. The theme for next week is The Way of the Cross John 12: (20 - 33)

Truly, I say to you, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. (John 12: 24 -25)

The pilgrims head to Jerusalem for the Passover. They will sacrifice a lamb to atone for their sins. However, this time, Jesus himself will be the lamb. Jesus makes the ultimate sacrifice. He accepts the Cross. It is for us. He is the grain of wheat referred to in John's Gospel. When a grain is buried and dies, it produces fruit. Life is suspended when the seed is buried. The great loss of Jesus at the crucifixion, has become our great hope at his resurrection – and we will soon celebrate this great hope at Easter! When we are struggling in life – just remember, we often grow stronger by these experiences – even though it does not feel like that at the time.
