NSPCC NEW HELPLINE FOR PEOPLE WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED SEXUAL HARASSMENT OR ABUSE IN EDUCATION

The NSPCC has launched a dedicated helpline for children and young people who have experienced sexual harassment or abuse at school, and for worried adults and professionals that need support and guidance. The helpline, Report Abuse in Education, launched on 1 April is run in conjunction with the Department for Education (DfE), who have commissioned this initiative. The bespoke helpline will provide appropriate support and advice to victims of abuse and harassment, and concerned adults, including onward action such as contacting the police if they wish to. We have noticed an increase in girls wearing unsuitable footwear in the warmer weather. An example is in the image below. As you can see this sandal type shoe gives no protection against the wet weather and little stability/protection when walking. We do not classify these as shoes as they do not have a completed sole, surrounding the foot. As a result, this type of footwear is not acceptable. We recognise that parents will need time to resolve such issues. Therefore, we have set a deadline of Monday, 10 May to correct such footwear. Thank you for your support.
