#### **USE OF THE 19 STEPS PATHWAY**

Please understand that use of the pathway along the side of school, known as the '19 Steps' will be **strictly prohibited for all of our pupils, both before and after school, from Monday, 17 May 2021** until further notice. This means that all of the passes issued to pupils are cancelled as of Monday, without exception.

This action is necessary as a number of questionable characters have been seen using this pathway after school and their involvement in drug use is very clear. We cannot of course prevent 'outsiders' from using the pathway but none of our pupils will be allowed to. This action is necessary to protect our school community and I look for complete support from all of our parents and carers. I have notified the police and asked for their support.

Our next year's Year 7 pupils will be joining us for a day in school on Monday, 5 July 2021. As is our practice, **Year 8 and 9** pupils are to remain home on that day. This will enable us to release teachers to work with the Year 6 pupils.

## SCHOOL TRANSPORT: FACE COVERINGS

We have received the following instructions from the Dedicated School Transport Team in Lancashire regarding the Department For Education requirements for face coverings. I pass it through to families without alteration:

As you will be aware, on 10 May 2021 the Department for Education updated its guidance to state that "From 17 May, in line with Step 3 of the roadmap, face coverings will no longer be recommended for pupils in classrooms or communal areas in all schools". However, the guidance continues to say that, "children and young people aged 11 and over **must still wear a face covering on public transport.** In accordance with advice from PHE, they **must also wear a face covering when travelling on dedicated transport to secondary school or college.** This does not apply to children and young people who are exempt from wearing face coverings".

We shall continue to expect that all of our pupils wear face coverings on our dedicated school transport for the entire journey both to and from school. Your support with these measures has been very strong indeed and will have been one of the reasons why instances of transmission of the virus have been so low at our school. Thank you.
