ADMISSIONS – SEPTEMBER 2022

The process of applying for high school places for September 2022 has now begun for Year 6 pupils. Parents wishing to choose Our Lady's should apply online by following the link below or via the link on the school website.

Parents should ensure that preferences are selected in the correct order as Lancashire County Council always aim to offer places in order of preference. Please be aware that it is necessary to apply even if a brother or sister is already at Our Lady's and it is imperative that all applications are received **before the deadline of 31 October 2021.**

In addition to the Lancashire application process, we ask that a Supplementary Information Form is completed if you wish to be considered on faith grounds.
