PUPIL ATTENDANCE REMINDER

School has a legal requirement to record accurate attendance information. It is vitally important therefore that when a pupil is absent from school parents/carers <u>contact school each day of their child's absence.</u> The attendance line is 01772-326914 or email <u>cbo@olchs.lancs.sch.uk</u> The only exception is for Covid and there must be evidence of a positive test provided. If no contact is received, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised and this may subsequently affect pupils' opportunity to take part in rewards trips. Pupils may wake up feeling a little bit under the weather on occasion but often they feel better as the day goes on. We would encourage the pupil to attend school where we would keep an eye on them and contact parents if needed.

ROAD SAFETY

On Wednesday, 15 September Year 7 pupils took part in a live and interactive Road Safety Awareness Workshop, provided by Performance in Education and Lancashire County Council. Pupils watched an exciting drama about 3 high school pupils and were then tasked with spotting the near misses and involved in a discussion around road safety. Pupil feedback was extremely positive, and pupils felt that they very much needed a refresher on how to stay safe when walking or cycling to or from school. It was a great event, and we hope that pupils take away some very important road safety messages and feel much more alert when travelling to and from school.

FOTBALL NEWS

Year 10

The Year 10 team played their first competitive inter-school football match since February 2020 against Archbishop Temple on Monday, 20 September. The team of 15 players were eager to get their new school season underway with a win and got off to a great start when Toby Atherton scored from a neat finish on the edge of the penalty area after being assisted by Harry Hargreaves. However, the opposition rallied and led by their talented captain,

scored their own well taken goal after outwitting our defence with a quick turn and strike from the edge of the area. The second half saw Our Lady's push forwards with attack after attack, but the opposition goalkeeper was not stretched enough as he found the strikes from the Our Lady's midfield either off target or straight towards his safe hands. Finally, Toby Atherton latched onto a diagonal pass from midfield that deceived the off-side trap and neatly took control to then hit the bottom corner of the goal to give Our Lady's a 2-1 lead. However, the lead slipped away in the final 5 minutes when a mishit shot from a corner bounced in off the post to give Archbishop Temple a very fortunate 2-2 draw. The team seemed a little disappointed not to get the result they came for, but they all enjoyed the camaraderie of playing together and representing Our Lady's once again after such a long wait.

What a feeling it was to return to competitive sport. The Year 11 football team travelled to Archbishop Temple School on Monday 20th September. To no surprise, both teams were disorganised and couldn't settle on the ball. It was crying out for a moment of quality and composure to break the deadlock. After fifteen minutes, Tiarnán Hayes chested down a through ball and slotted the ball in the corner. 1-0 Our Lady's. This was shortly added to, in similar fashion, by Ethan Fox with another controlled finish from the left. A third was then added by Jack Dickinson following the brilliant vision of Isaac Chew. Ubaid Hansrod made it 4-0 just before the break, capitalising on a mistake made by the opposition goalkeeper. The second half continued in the same vein. More direct football was required due to the conditions of the pitch. The team responded to feedback and were more efficient with the ball. More chances were created, some missed, some converted but their efforts never faltered and their desire to keep a clean sheet was admirable. Ethan Dalton intelligently read the game throughout; goalkeeper Malachy McGuire thoroughly commanded his box and made a couple of fantastic saves. The game finished 8-0 to Our Lady's. Well done to all involved.
