ROAD SAFETY AND RESPECTFUL PARKING

Topics and themes covered are listed below -

Year 7 - Day of Reflection

Pupils also looked at how to ensure that throughout the year they will live up to the Year Group Motto 'Be kind, work hard'. Throughout the day we had the chance to get to know our Form Group better, through a mix of team building activities and faith building activities. Pupils have given extremely positive feedback from the day, and our favourite activities included the affirmation game with Form Tutors, the Emmaus walk with Father Mario, Sister Sheinrose and Terry, and creating the stars and pledge cards for our chapel and Welcome Mass.

Year 8 - Online Media

How the media portrays young people, online bullying, your body, your image, online presence and reputation, financial risks and gambling.

Year 9 - Be Healthy

Healthy living, drugs awareness, risks and consequences of substance abuse, hygiene and vaccination, reducing the cancer risk.

Year 10 - British Values and Citizenship

Tolerance, respect and diversity, judiciary, democratic processes and citizenship, equality and diversity, discrimination - protected characteristics.

Year 11 - Internet Safety and Harms

Positive role models, influencers and digital manipulation, trolling and sexting, forums and online bullying, fake news, kick starters and crowdsourcing.
