GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

GCSE Geography Year 11s were excited to travel to Liverpool last week to investigate "To what extent is Liverpool a global city?" They first spent time in the Museum of Liverpool to learn about the history of Liverpool as a port city, the development and then decline of the Albert Docks and how the city is now influential globally. They learned how Liverpool was European Capital of Culture in 2008 and received millions in funding from the EU to develop the famous Pier Head terminal for the Ferry Cross the Mersey and the engineering feat of the floating docks. Working in groups, they then collected data on the land use at the Albert Dock and the environmental quality of the area, learning how this World Heritage site draws in people from around the world. We finished the day by looking at an excellent example of regeneration - Liverpool One - and learning about how cities are choosing to use "urban greening" as a way of making urban spaces more sustainable. The pupils were a real credit to the school and have learned an invaluable amount of information to help them with both their Unit 2 and Unit 3 exams next summer.

NATIONAL POETRY DAY

National Poetry Day was celebrated in style on Thursday, 7 October 2021 within school. The theme this year was choice and our choice to launch National Poetry Day as an annual event in school has been hugely successful. Poetry appeared all around school as staff chose to share their favourite poems with pupils and departments chose poems linked to their curriculum areas to share too. Pupils' poetry now decorates some of our beautiful trees as their poems, written on paper leaves, have been transformed into 'poetrees'!

LIVE PERFORMANCE - MENTAL HEALTH / ONLINE SAFETY / CYBER BULLYING

On Thursday, 7 October both Year 7 and Year 8 participated in a live performance discussing issues surrounding mental health concerns, online safety and cyber bullying. Pupils watched a live performance from the band 'Here At Last' and participated in a Q & A session. Feedback from both staff and pupils has been extremely positive, and we all thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to welcome live musicians back into school.

FOOTBALL NEWS

Unfortunately, the **Year 8** football team lost their first ever game representing Our Lady's Catholic High School. They faced a very tough, hard-working, and skillful team from Broughton High School on Wednesday, 6th October 2021. The team had a mixture of excitement and nerves before the game; this translated into the first ten minutes. Broughton controlled possession and played great football in the first half. They created lots of chances and went into the half-time interval with a 2-0 lead. The Our Lady's players were encouraged to think and apply the basic tactics, strategies and skills both with and without the ball. The second half was a much better display and saw some fantastic individual performances all across the pitch. The team were much more positive and were very unlucky not to score two or three goals. Broughton were always a threat and continued to create chances. The game finished 6-0 to the visitors. The team were disappointed of course, but many positives were taken from the experience; players were praised for specific contributions. Following the game, all were given a moment to reflect on how they can improve and take their positivity and actions into the next game on Monday 11th against Archbishop Temple High School.

The **Year 9** team extended their unbeaten run to 3 games with a thrilling 3-2 win over Broughton High School. The game took place at Our Lady's on Wednesday 6th October. All members of the team were excited to be facing what they knew would be their toughest game of the year so far. As the game began it was clear that Our Lady's were keen to get the first goal and continuous pressure from Bruce Leeming and Jack Meers in the centre of midfield helped to create many early chances. However, we could not quite take the lead. Broughton had few real opportunities to score in the first half but took the lead during a counter attack and then doubled their lead soon after to take a surprising 0-2 lead after being under relentless pressure from Our Lady's. Liam Taylor soon pulled one back for the hosts which halved the deficit at the break. Into the second half and the Our Lady's players continued to pile the pressure on Broughton and it eventually paid off after a fantastic header from Bruce Leeming, assisted by a Rhys Spickett corner, made the scores level at 2-2. Into the final few minutes and Our Lady's were desperate for the win. Harry Ratcliffe's long range shot was fumbled by the Broughton goalkeeper and Rhys Spickett was first to get to the ball and confidently hit the back of the net to secure a well earned 3-2 victory. This win will give the team even more confidence when going into their Lancashire Cup 1st round game against St Mary's, Blackpool.
