LATERAL FLOW DEVICE TESTS

Schools have been advised as part of Plan B, to request that parents and carers take a LFD test if they are coming into school for a meeting. This is not necessary if you are simply visiting Reception for a couple of minutes but it is expected for a visit that takes you into another part of school or requires you to be in school for more than a couple of minutes.

The DfE have also made it clear that families should continue with LFD tests at home at least twice a week. We have a full stock of LFD test kits at school which will be given to your child upon request. If you have been pinged or been in contact with someone who has had a positive test, you and your child should do a LFD test every day for a week.

The DfE have also mandated that schools again arrange for an LFD test to be done on all children whose parents/carers give consent. Thank you for those who have responded with the consent, a separate email has been sent with times.

Your support in helping us to make school a safe environment is appreciated as always.
