BRONZE DUKE OF EDINBURGH PRACTICE EXPEDITION

Over the weekend 1 – 3 July, 60 of our Year 9 pupils completed their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Practice expedition. On Friday, half of the group were dropped off in Garstang and completed a guided walk to Guys Farm campsite, via Nicky Nook. On the walk they had the chance to practice their map reading skills under expert guidance, all whilst carrying their food, clothes, stoves and tents on their backs! Once at camp, they put up their tents, cooked their food and kept in high spirits despite the torrential rain! In the morning, they completed a circular walk from the camp with staff checkpointing the route along the way. On Saturday afternoon the second group of pupils were dropped at Guys farm and completed a guided walk from Guys, camped and then completed their solo walk on the Sunday back to Garstang via Nicky Nook. All pupils showed excellent resilience, teamwork and the ability to remain positive even when lost in the countryside! All is in preparation for their assessment weekend that will take place in September.
