Lancaster University School of Mathematics



On Monday, 13th March, pupils in Year 11x1E had a taster session with Ella McConville from The Lancaster University School of Maths (LUSoM).

Within the session, pupils were given a chance to test their problem solving and reasoning skills on different aspects of Maths beyond GCSE level. Pupils learnt about the opportunities available at LUSoM and ways in which they could follow a pathway linked to STEM subjects; taught in a different way, in a brand new setting in Preston. The Entrepreneur Competition

All year 8 pupils will be taking part in The Entrepreneur Enterprise Competition in their Design & Technology lessons, starting on Monday 20th March. Pupils will be working in groups of three and will been given a £10 loan by OLCHS. The loans are repayable on 10th May 2023 for forms O, U & R and 11th May 2023 for forms L, A & D.

They must run enterprising activities (the Easter holidays will be good for this!), which will allow them to make as much profit from their loan as possible. All profit is to be kept and equally distributed within the groups. Each group will make a short presentation (including photographic evidence) to their class about their activities and a winning team from each class will be selected and then go on to compete in a grand final on 17th May. RULES

- Pupils are not allowed to do the lottery or play the lottery.
- Pupils must not sell goods within school time under any circumstances. This includes selling sweets on the quad or yard at break or lunch.
- Pupils should refrain from cake sales and car washes, trying to be more creative with their ideas.
- All groups will be expected to pay the £10 loan back in full.
- The work that pupils do in their groups must be divided up equally between all three members. Profit must be shared out equally at the end of the activity.
