Open Evening

I wrote to parents last week to give an update on the remedial work being carried out following the change in government guidance surrounding RAAC. We have been delighted to welcome all our pupils back into school and they have responded incredibly well to the change in logistics around using outside paths to get to their classrooms. The building contractors are working hard, and they plan to have completed the remedial work in the small sections of corridors by October half-term which will enable access to all our classrooms.

As we have several corridors with restricted access, we have taken the decision to postpone our annual Open Evening which was due to take place on Thursday 5th October. Each year we welcome over a thousand visitors through the door on the evening but with the restricted access to certain areas of the school it just would not be possible to accommodate everyone. In its place we will be hosting a Virtual Open Event which will go live on our school website on 5th October. The following week, we will also hold our Open Day tours which we hold each year however, this year we will increase the number we offer. We will be opening online booking for these tours shortly via our website.

On Thursday 5th October, school will finish at our normal time as there is no requirement to prepare the building for an in person Open Evening. Friday 6th October remains an INSET day with pupils at home as per our published calendar.

Parents should ensure that preferences are selected in the correct order as Lancashire County council always aim to offer places in order of preference. Please be aware that it is necessary to apply even if a brother or sister is already at our lady's and it is imperative that all applications are received before the deadline of 31 October 2023.

In addition to the Lancashire application process, we ask that a supplementary information form is completed if you wish to be considered on faith grounds. To ensure your child is on track with their homework, we kindly request your involvement. Please take a moment to engage with your child regarding their homework assignments. You can ask them to show you their planners or the completed homework tasks to get a sense of their progress.

We understand that some pupils may require a quiet space to focus on their homework. Our Learning Resource Centre (LRC) is available every day until 4.30pm (4pm on Tuesday), providing a peaceful environment for pupils to work on their assignments. Please encourage your child to take advantage of this resource, if needed.

If, at any point, your child is struggling with their homework or has questions about the assignments, we strongly encourage them to reach out to their teachers. They should approach their teachers for clarification or assistance before the deadline. Additionally, you can support your child by reminding them to communicate with their teachers or assist them in sending an email if necessary.

Confidentiality

Texts will only be seen between 9am and 5pm Monday to Finday (excluding bank holidays). If you need help before you hear back from us, contact your GP, nearest walk-in centre or dial 111. If it is an emergency call 999 or go to the emergency department (ASE). Our text number does not receive voice calls or fMMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some "number masking" mobile apps). To prevent the health professional from sending messages to you, text STOP to our number.
