



Year 11 Lancashire Cup Football

Our Year 11 boys played Broughton in the first round of the Lancashire Cup this Monday. The game was evenly matched from the very beginning with both teams coming close to opening the scoreline - but for the post to be in the way, or some stunning work by both goalkeepers.

Broughton did, however, find the back of the net first to take the lead but a lovely weighted through-ball from Bruce Leeming to Declan Abbott saw a cool and calm finish bring scores level before the half time whistle.

The match was being played at Corpus Christi however, due to their inset day, the floodlights had not been switched on and the light began fading fast within the second half. This did not deter either side with both teams pushing on to take advantage in the match. With 15 minutes left to play, Broughton chipped our goalkeeper and looked sure to hold on to their winning position.

With 4 minutes left and the light all but gone, a floated corner from Rhys Spickett caused a goalmouth scramble which resulted in the ball bundling over the line and an equaliser was found by Our Lady's. (It was so dark at this point, it was hard to confirm who scored it!).

Then, in the closing minute .. the light now gone.. one last kick of the ball up-field from Henry Latham in our goal caused a bit of chaos for the Broughton back line. Their goalkeeper rushed out to kick the ball clear only for it to bounce off the back of Liam Taylor's head, rebounding the ball into the back of the net.

Final score 3-2 with Our Lady's progressing through to the next round of the cup where they will play Darwen Aldridge Academy (date to be confirmed).

The final score was 12-4 to us. Player of the match went to Amy Ross. However, Lilian Ezeani got teachers' player due to some fantastically timed interceptions, using her height well in the circle.


