To ensure a fantastic day for all, please adhere to the following:

- The costume must be easily distinguishable / distinctive to the character;
- Hair colouring, make-up, jewellery, etc. are all allowed and encouraged, if in keeping with the character. The bigger, the better!
- Onesies are acceptable, if distinctive to the character;
- A copy of the book, or photocopy of the front cover of the book, must be brought into school and be kept with the pupil for the duration of the day (order from local library or school library, or photocopy beforehand, if not owned);
- No revealing clothes i.e. midriff showing, strappy tops or short skirts to be worn;
- No inappropriate slogans, messages, or images on any item of clothing;
- Pupils are not to simply wear their own recreational clothes (joggers and a hoody etc.). The character must be easily identifiable. Balaclavas are not allowed.
- All adornments (hair colours, etc.) must return to adhere our school uniform policy by Monday, 11th March.


The Ukulele Orchestra is student-led and the group make their own choices about repertoire. Players work together to teach each other's the chords and strumming patterns for the different pieces of music.

In Maths

On Friday 2nd February, Year 7B1 and 7B2 were involved in a taster session with Mr Bercial from the Lancaster University School of Mathematics (LUSOM). In the sessions pupils were introduced to the Axiom Circles sessions that are run at their campus in Preston.

Pupils were given the opportunity to test their mathematical thinking against a range of problems and discuss their different approaches. If pupils are interested to find out more they can enrol using the link below. Sessions take place every Wednesday (4.30pm - 5.30pm) at the LUSoM building on London Road in Preston (near the Range). In the circles, students are guided by a mentor to work through maths problems which challenge their thinking and require problem-solving skills.
