A number of different work placements were attended by our pupils ranging from accountants, vets, nurseries, and beauticians This year we saw a wider range of industries represented than ever before and some of our pupils used this as an opportunity to try out jobs that they aspire to in the future, including working as part of the Crown Prosecution Service, and for one pupil, as an astrophysicist working at Jodrell Bank radio telescope array.

To ensure a fantastic day for all, please adhere to the following:

- The costume must be easily distinguishable / distinctive to the character;
- Hair colouring, make-up, jewellery, etc. are all allowed and encouraged, if in keeping with the character. The bigger, the better!
- Onesies are acceptable, if distinctive to the character;
- A copy of the book, or photocopy of the front cover of the book, must be brought into school and be kept with the pupil for the duration of the day (order from local library or school library, or photocopy beforehand, if not owned);
- No revealing clothes i.e. midriff showing, strappy tops or short skirts to be worn;
- No inappropriate slogans, messages, or images on any item of clothing;
- Pupils are not to simply wear their own recreational clothes (joggers and a hoody etc.). The character must be easily identifiable. Balaclavas are not allowed.
- All adornments (hair colours, etc.) must return to adhere our school uniform policy by Monday, 11th March.

Congratulations to Naomi, a pupil at Our Lady's, who last Saturday participated in the Ali's Dojang Open 2024 in London, her first competition this year. She participated in two categories - the Individual U14 Female and Team U14 Female.

In the Individual category, she got her personal best score and beat 15 players out of 20 to get into the Final, which was her target. In the Team category, her team clinched the 2nd position and won Silver medals. Naomi's next Taekwondo competition is in April and we wish her every success.

In their final 3 games of the group they won 2 and lost 1, finishing in 3rd place in the group.
