To ensure a fantastic day for all, please adhere to the following:

- The costume must be easily distinguishable / distinctive to the character;
- Hair colouring, make-up, jewellery, etc. are all allowed and encouraged, if in keeping with the character. The bigger, the better!
- Onesies are acceptable, if distinctive to the character;
- A copy of the book, or photocopy of the front cover of the book, must be brought into school and be kept with the pupil for the duration of the day (order from local library or school library, or photocopy beforehand, if not owned);
- No revealing clothes i.e. midriff showing, strappy tops or short skirts to be worn;
- No inappropriate slogans, messages, or images on any item of clothing;
- Pupils are not to simply wear their own recreational clothes (joggers and a hoody etc.). The character must be easily identifiable. Balaclavas are not allowed.

All adornments (hair colours, etc.) must return to adhere our school uniform policy by Monday, 11th March.





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Duke of Edinburgh Celebration Evening



On Thursday evening we celebrated the achievements of 64 of our Year 10 and 11 students who have gained their Bronze and Silver Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) Awards.

To complete the DofE Award you need time management, resilience, teamwork and leadership skills. It has been wonderful to see these qualities grow and develop in our students.

The Award is not just about the physical challenge of the expedition it also includes developing a skill and volunteering. We are proud with how generous our students have been with their time supporting our school and our local community through volunteering, collectively they have contributed more than 800 hours of community service. All of the Duke of Edinburgh students have been learning a new, or developing an existing skill and we have seen a huge range of skills which have been started or enhanced through the Award. Our students have been active, improving their physical fitness through taking part in both team and individual sports and they have shown themselves to be attentive and compassionate towards each other whilst on expedition.

During the presentation evening students shared their experiences of the Award and reflected on what they had learnt from completing it. Students and their parents and carers then were treated to a motivational talk from Darren Edwards with his message about creating a purpose in life of who you want to be and work towards that. Finally, students collected their hard-earned certificates and badges.

Motivational Talks


On Thursday, students in Years 7, 8 and 9 all received a motivational talk from Darren Edwards.

Darren is a former Mountaineer and Army Reservist who was paralysed in a near death climbing accident at the age of 26. Since then, Darren has become an active paraadventurer, expedition leader and author who has become a passionate champion of the phrase "strength through adversity".

Adventure has been at the heart of Darren's recovery. Since sustaining his life-changing injury and becoming paralysed from the chest down, Darren has taken on new and ambitious challenges – whether that be completing a marathon on every continent in 7 days or becoming the first person to kayak from Land's End to John O' Groats – a distance of over 1,400 kilometres across some of Europe's most challenging coastal waters.

Darren spoke to the students about the fact that "we are not affected by events but the view that we take of them" and encouraged students to be accountable for their own lives by "facing it, owning it and changing it". He also encouraged students to create a purpose or a mission statement for their lives, living by it and working towards it.

Feedback from the students was that the talk was incredibly inspirational and the questions that they asked during the Q and A session were wonderful.
