



New this academic year, Bedrock Learning (a programme that supports the development of vocabulary and reading) is showing impact already. In the first term, Year 7 pupils have learned 5,000 new pieces of vocabulary and been exposed to 15,000 new pieces of vocabulary. In addition, the Year Group have made 17% progress.

Year 7 pupils complete Bedrock Learning in school through their LRC lesson fortnightly and as part of their homework. To make progress pupils need to be gaining approximately 20 points per week. Completion rates are high, and the department are grateful for the support from parents and guardians.



### What Extra-Curricular Opportunities are There?

#### **Year 7 Fiction Addiction Club:**

This reading club runs weekly on Tuesday lunchtimes in the LRC with Mrs Towers, our fabulous Librarian, and Miss Slade, our Principal Teacher of English. We complete a craft or quiz style activity and read the opening of novels to inspire us to read them. Pupils' feedback on the club is excellent: they enjoy the activities and range of novel openings.



To support the Bedrock programme, and help pupils to keep up the homework part of this, our Principal Teacher, Miss Slade, runs a Bedrock Club on Wednesday lunchtimes in Room 10. Pupils come along with their lunch and catch up or get ahead. There's a lovely atmosphere and all Year 7s are welcome. Those who need to catch up are required to attend in order to ensure the programme is successful for them.



#### **Debate Club:**

All pupils are welcome at the Debate Club coordinated by Mrs Stopyra and run by the pupils for the pupils. Debate Club runs on Fridays in Room 12 and pupils choose their topics to debate. A lively debate can always be expected!



#### The benefits of debating are as follows:

- 1. Pupils improve their critical thinking skills.
- 2. Pupils acquire better poise, speech delivery, and public speaking skills.
- 3. Pupils retain more information.
- 4. Pupils Improve their listening and note-taking skills and increase their self-confidence.
- 5. Pupils enhance their teamwork skills and collaboration.
- 6. Pupils develop more confidence to stand up for the truth when a discussion is promoting falsehoods or inaccuracies.
- 7. Pupils learn better ways to state one's point with gentleness graciously.
- 8. Pupils learn to identify holes in their theories and concoct more balanced arguments.
- 9. Pupils learn to better structure their thoughts.
- 10.Debating is lots of fun!

#### **Debate Club:**




#### Year 11 Boys' Revision Club:





## **Preston Schools' Indoor Cricket Competition**

A group of over forty Our Lady's girls from Year 7 to Year 10 have been training hard after school every Friday for the past few weeks in preparation for the annual Preston Schools' Indoor Cricket Competition. We have been fortunate enough to have Lauren Burrow in to lead the sessions. Lauren works with the Lancashire Cricket Foundation and one of her main roles is to promote girls' cricket in the area. It was the turn of the U13 team to play first and Miss Lewis had a very difficult decision to make in terms of who was in the squad, as commitment to training has been fantastic, but we were only able to enter one team.

A squad of eight was selected to compete against Broughton and Archbishop. We played the hosts, Archbishop first. The captain, Umika P took three wickets thanks to her fantastic speed and accurate bowling. We also had some excellent catches from Eden P, Katie H and Scarlett A. All the girls fielded well, backing each other up and making it hard for Archbishop to get runs on the board. Consequently, we won our first game 67 runs to 55.

Once again, we took lots of early wickets as a result of consistent bowling from Umika P, Fearne B and Georgia S.
