The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes - Our Lady of Lourdes Statue Tour

"Do whatever he tells you." (John 2:5)

Our Lady of Lourdes holds a special place in our Diocese as our Patron.

The 11th February marks her feast day, and we are privileged to be the first school on the tour to receive this beautiful statue, marking the Centenary of the Diocese of Lancaster.

In 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Saint Bernadette in Lourdes, France. Mary asked for prayer, repentance, and a chapel to be built on the site. These apparitions continue to inspire millions of pilgrims each year to turn to Our Lady for healing and intercession. Mary's appearance at Lourdes to Saint Bernadette reflects her deep compassion for and identification with the poor. Saint Bernadette came from a very humble and uneducated background, yet Mary chose to appear to her in the simple grotto at Lourdes.



This week within school we have been celebrating The Lancashire Cyber Festival Education Week.

There have been various events that pupils have taken part in. The aim of the week is to inspire and enable young people to understand the potential cyber related career pathways open to them and highlight the county's once in a generation cyber opportunity brought by the National Cyber Force Headquarters being established in Lancashire.

Year 10 pupils were invited to Preston College to enjoy a range of interactive Cyber and Tech related activities as well as wider topics including Languages, Psychology and Maths. Pupils discussed potential training and career options in STEM and cyber.

On Wednesday, the whole of Year 9 took part in a virtual TeenTech Innovation Live session. The session was live and interactive and allowed pupils to ask questions and participate with quiz questions. The session was on the topic of Al and Cybersecurity with leading employers showcasing exciting aspects of their work. Pupils could ask questions to a member of the research and development team at the BBC as well as two members of ORACLE, one being an apprentice. Pupils asked some great questions and some were asked during the live session. Pupils were also invited to join the TeenTech awards if they chose to take part. On Thursday, 30 **Year 8** girls were invited to the CyberFirst MEGA event organised by IN4 Group on behalf of CyberFirst at Chorley Town hall. The aim of the day was to empower a diverse range of young people to consider exciting careers in cybersecurity, with a particular focus on encouraging girls to build skills and interest in technology early in their education.

During this session pupils visited a number of different workshops around the room. This included Augmented Reality, Virtual Reality, Microbits, Spheos, Robots and many more. The day included programming the different items to solve problems. All of the girls had a great time. Comments included, "Brilliant!", "Very educational and very worthwhile.", "If other girls have the opportunity to go, I highly recommend it!".









Our school was also commented on by a speaker from Lancaster University who was extremely impressed with the girls' skills in binary as well as the way they conducted themselves.




Recycle Old Costumes!

Next week sees the Year 7s take to the Sports Hall Athletics competition and we are hoping for another podium finish!








TABLE TENNIS
