SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION 2018

On Pentecost Sunday, 20 May 2018 at 2.30pm, at the Cathedral, Lancaster, Bishop Michael OSA will be administering the Sacrament of Confirmation. To all those in Years 10 and 11 in the parish of SS Mary & Michael, who wish to be Confirmed, please contact either Fr Tom Butler or Alison Dodd for a letter inviting you to enrol for the course of preparation. Alternatively, there are some at the back of church ready to collect. You will need to show commitment to the programme and attendance is essential. The sessions will commence on Tuesday, 20 March at 6.30pm. The sessions will each last 1&1/2 hours and will be take place at the parish centre. There will be a total of 7 sessions and an away day. The last session, a shorter session, will be on Tuesday, 15 May, the Tuesday before the Sacrament of Confirmation.

CPR TRAINING

As a school we are rolling out CPR training for all pupils. The British Heart Foundation have a mission to create a 'Nation of Lifesavers' and, as a school, we believe that this is a crucial life skill for all our pupils. Across the UK there are over 30,000 cardiac arrests outside of hospital each year, but the survival rate is less than 1 in 10. In Norway, all school children are taught CPR and the survival rate is 1 in 4. Over the next 18 months, every child at OLCHS will be taught CPR during form time. Every child will be taught how to check for breathing, how to do chest compressions and how to give emergency breaths. This initial training will be followed up with reminder lessons, to ensure that our pupils are confident in delivering this life saving skill in an emergency.

This team have continued to build on a good start in the Lancashire Schools' Cup competition by beating All Hallows 7-2 in the second round of the competition. The game was played at Penwortham Priory's 3G pitch on a bitterly cold Wednesday afternoon in early January. Our Lady's were soon 1-0 down after leaving a large gap in defence which was capitalised on by our opposition who scored with ease. The team then stepped up a gear and began to play some nice, flowing football and eventually Luke Smith turned and hit a left-footed drive, deceiving the goalkeeper to level the game. We continued to push forwards and soon the goals came in abundance. Dominic Richmond ending with 4 goals and Luke Smith 3. Outstanding performances in defence from Reuben Gibbs, Ethan Dalton and Jack Dickinson ensured that goalkeeper Malachy McGuire was rarely tested. The team play the winners of St Bede's, Blackburn or Haslingden High in the next round.
