The Year 10 Football team was knocked out of the Lancashire Schools' Cup competition on Friday, 26 January by Ripley St Thomas' of Lancaster. Our defenders found themselves up against two strong centre forwards who used their size and strength to create chances for their team early on in the game, however goalkeeper Ben Pomfret pulled off some good saves to keep the game at 0-0 for the majority of the fixture.
