Our Prayer theme next week is The Good Shepherd

Y11 ENGLISH REVISION - EDMODO

The English Department has created a group page on the educational app 'Edmodo' so all Year 11 pupils can access revision materials on their phones, iPads and computers. We have uploaded a variety of resources to the group that will help with revision over the coming months, including PowerPoint presentations, educational advice articles, YouTube clips and cue cards. This app enables pupils to access these resources at any point during the day, whether they're on their journey to school or waiting for their favourite TV programme to come on! It has been proven that short bursts of revision are most effective and this app allows pupils to do that in an easy and positive way.

All Year 11 pupils will be informed about the app and its benefit over the coming week. To join the group all they need to do is...

- 1. Download **EDMODO** from the app store. (It's free!)
- 2. Create an account. An email address and a password is needed.
- 3. Search for the revision group. It's called **OLCHS Y11 English Revision.**
- 4. Once they find the group, they need to type in the unique access code. The group code is **ysepws**.
