MR RANSON'S SPONSORED WALK

We all arrived at Castlerigg Manor for 9.30am on Bank Holiday Monday and climbed into the mini bus to drive south to Grasmere where the walk began. The party of eleven set off on a steep climb to the top of Stone Arthur, the first of our 12 peaks. Onward then to Great Rigg and then to Fairfield. This was the hottest phase of the walk but a great achievement. We now had to lose height as we descended over 300 feet to the stunning Grisedale Tarn. This was followed by a steep climb up to Dollywaggon and on to Nethermost Pike. Helvellyn was still to come, the highest point of our challenge which was about seven miles into the walk. With six more peaks to climb and eight miles to go I was feeling very short of energy, breath and water. However the group spirit was fabulous and that really kept me going. On to White Side, Stybarrow Dodd, Watson's Dodd, Great Dodd, Calfhow Pike and then the final summit of Clough Head. At this point Bishop Paul suggested a slightly quicker route down which was proved to be the most difficult downhill section of the walk. Miraculously he was then at the bottom waiting for us to arrive; I think he may have run down but he is a 'hard case' walker and while this challenge was considerable for me, Bishop Paul appeared to manage it with ease. A simply fabulous day with wonderful people but very challenging for an occasional walker such as me.

Thank you very much to the numerous families who have sponsored me. At the time of writing (Tuesday 5 June), the total raised so far is £905 toward our target of £1000. Including gift aid we are on £1055 but Mr Charnock has told me that I am not allowed to count the gift aid part toward the target as it is a bonus so there is still £95 to raise if possible!
