FOOTBALL NEWS

Year 7

The Year 7 football team travelled to Corpus Christi High School on Friday, October 19th. They were playing Fulwood Academy and Corpus Christi in a round robin format. The winner would progress to the next stages of the Lancashire Cup. Our Lady's were spectators (literally) in the first game as Fulwood beat Corpus Christi in a close game. Our Lady's then played Fulwood straight after their win. The game was very even with Fulwood the better team in the first half and Our Lady's the better team in the second half. Fulwood scored a goal in the first half to make it 1-0 at the break. Midfielders were caught ball watching and not tracking their runners which resulted in strong counter attacks from Fulwood. In the second half, Our Lady's took control of the game, winning more tackles, passing the ball quickly and countering as a team. Unfortunately, the quality of the final pass or shot was not good enough to trouble the Fulwood goalkeeper. A draw would have been a fair result, but the game ended 1-0 to Fulwood Academy. The second game against Corpus Christi was thrilling. The hosts were dominant in the first half, dispatching four goals to make it 4-0 at half time. The same issues that occurred in the first game arose again. Seven changes were made at half time, purely to give everyone an equal amount of minutes. It was immediately evident that the new players wanted to make a point. They pressed the opposition increasing the number of mistakes they made. They also increased the number of shots, forcing the Corpus Christi goalkeeper to make a number of great saves. They managed to score three goals creating a thrilling ending, but it just wasn't enough. The result at the final whistle, 4-3. It was a very enjoyable night and a valuable learning experience for all. The squad are now looking forward to the league games starting this half-term.

The defence continued to struggle with Broughton's long ball tactics and within minutes of the second half re-starting they scored again to make it 3-0. Cian Hayes pulled a goal back for Our Lady's with a magnificent solo effort to give the team hope, but it was soon dashed when Broughton were awarded a penalty which they scored to extend their lead to 4-1. Our Lady's continued to work hard, knowing a draw would be enough to secure top spot, but within the efforts to go forward to score they left the door open in defence for Broughton to score again with the last kick of the game to make the final result 5-1. Thursday's game was in the first round of the English Schools Competition and we had been drawn away to St Michael's CE School, Chorley.
