

YEAR 7 ENTERPRISE CHALLENGE

All Year 7 pupils took part in the school heat of the National Enterprise Challenge. They worked in groups of six and were given the task of developing a creative way of using empty gas canisters in an environmentally friendly way. The teams also had to give thought about how to promote and finance their idea. The day finished with a number of selected teams presenting their ideas to a panel of judges who then selected a winning team. The winning team, 'River Saver' should have gone on to represent OLCHS in the national finals in Birmingham in July, but we are currently not aware whether this will go ahead later in the year.

MOCK INTERVIEWS

On Tuesday 14th January our school hosted its second annual mock interview evening for Year 11 pupils. Thirty-two employers from across Lancashire bestowed us with their vast interviewing knowledge to ensure that our pupils were given a realistic and valuable experience. Our pupils prepared by reviewing current labour market information, career pathways and job specifications before deciding upon a job to be interviewed for. They also completed a personal CV that was given to their interviewer ahead of the interview. As the interview day drew closer, the pupils benefited from a session led by the 'Department for Work and Pensions' on how to give the best possible account of themselves in an interview situation, covering preparation, body language and essential tips on making the right impression.

The verbal and written feedback received by our pupils is likely to help them reflect on the encounter and better prepare them for their next interview situation.

CAREERS FAIR

On Wednesday 6th February we held our ever growing 5th annual Careers Fair in the Arts Theatre for all of our Year 10 and some Year 11 pupils, to assist them in making informed decisions about their future in further education, training or employment.

The event featured 30 stalls representing a wide variety of employers and further education providers. Amongst them was ex-head boy Stephen Bryan, who now works in Accountancy. Pupils had an hour to move around and speak to the visitors, with a pro-forma to complete that encouraged meaningful conversations about the skills, qualities and pathways required to be successful in a particular field.

The pupils left the event with a plethora of further reading materials and a greater insight into their future career paths.



YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE

From 10th—14th February, all Year 10 pupils undertook a week of Work Experience with local companies. The pupils sought out and applied for placements themselves and had to undertake an interview, just as they would in a real-life situation.

Once on placement they were treated as genuine employees and expected to adhere to the rules and standards of their workplace.

This gave our students a fantastic insight into the labour market and how to develop their employability skills. They returned to school after half term refreshed and with new-found skills.


