



#### **U13 Girls Cricket Competition**

The team of nine Year 7 and Year 8 students took part in the regional indoor schools' cricket finals after winning the district competition last month. The event was held at Bolton Arena with schools from across Lancashire representing their district.

The Our Lady's team played 3 games in their group, hoping to make it through to the semi-finals. The team lost their first game against St Michael's from Chorley 79-74 but convincingly won their second game against St Aiden's of Preesall 96-64. This meant that in order to secure a semi-final place they needed to win their third game against Lancaster Girls Grammar. Our Lady's batted first and scored an impressive 74 runs with Georgia S and Eden P getting the team off to a great start, running well between the wickets and communicating effectively. Umika P came in to bat 3rd and quickly scored an impressive 20 runs in one over, hitting two sixes and two fours.

At the change of inning it was our turn to bowl and the team knew they had to be secure with their fielding. All bowlers did an excellent job against a good batting team, with Umika P taking a wicket with the final bowl of the match. Agonisingly, the team were beaten by just one run with Lancaster Girls' finishing with 75 runs and progressing into the semi-finals.

#### **Year 7 Boys Football**




It wasn't until around 15 minutes in, that the deadlock was broken with a fine Max O strike and the Our Lady's boys were able to settle down and play some fabulous football.

#### **English**


