Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of another academic year and look ahead to the summer holidays, I want to take this opportunity to thank you — our wonderful parents and carers — for the unwavering support you offer your children and our school. I also extend my sincere gratitude to our dedicated and talented staff, who work tirelessly in the service of our young people, and to our committed governors, whose wisdom, care, and vision continue to guide our school so faithfully. Their focus is always for the good of our pupils, and I am deeply grateful for all that they do.

We are blessed with a very special school community, one in which pupils and staff alike seek to live out the virtues of **Being One of Ours**. In total we raised an amazing £1,003.41 for charity.





Archie Mc and Teddy J then added another 30 runs of their own to take the total to 165 before the final pair of Archie G and James S sealed the victory, hitting 4 sixes and 2 fours along with many other runs to finish the game with 203.
