There were lots of fun and engaging activities including creating giant banners which will be displayed in the Year 7 Mass of Welcome later in September.


Students all worked so hard, showing themselves to be kind, generous and loving as they made new friends, helped each other through challenges, and enjoyed being together.






















Joy and celebration filled the corridors of Our Lady's Catholic High School as students collected another set of outstanding GCSE results on Thursday 21 August 2025.

This year's achievements mark one of the school's strongest ever performances, with pupils excelling across all subjects, including English and Maths. A significant proportion of grades were awarded at 7–9, placing Our Lady's students amongst the very highest achievers nationally.

Headteacher Mr Richard Charnock praised the results as a reflection of the school's values and identity:
