

Homework Update AND TIPS FOR PARENTS

- 1. Completing homework on the night it is set can make it more manageable.
- 2. The Learning Resource Centre (LRC) and Learning Support are available after school for students who would like extra guidance.
- **3.** Organising tasks and deadlines clearly in a planner, and marking them off when complete, can help students keep track of their work.
- **4.** A quick check of the planner or Synergy after homework is finished can help ensure everything has been completed.
- **5.** Establishing a consistent time each day for homework, treated like a regular appointment, can help it become part of a daily routine.

These strategies are shared to support students in managing their workload and building effective study habits.

Year 8 Boys Football


