




#### **Our Oracy Essentials**


#### **OUTSTANDING LEADER AWARD 2025**

**Good attendance** is one of the most important factors in helping every student achieve their full potential.

Students with 95–100% attendance in Year 11 are almost twice as likely to achieve a Grade 5 or above in both English and Maths compared to those attending between 90–95%. Missing just 10 days of school in Year 11 can reduce the likelihood of achieving a Grade 5 in English and Maths by around 50%.

We are proud that attendance at Our Lady's Catholic High School continues to be well above the national average — a reflection of our students' dedication and our supportive school community.

# CAREER ASSEMBLIES

In school we have held Careers Information Assemblies for Our Lady's pupils to gain insight into their future pathways once they leave high school.

#### **Preston College**

On Monday we welcomed Dave Elliot from Preston College to speak to Year 11 about the courses Preston College offer, which included T Levels, Apprenticeships and BTEC courses. Pupils were advised to visit all of the local colleges by Dave to ensure pupils can make an informed decision. Preston College held their first Information Evening on Wednesday 1st October and have another in November which we strongly urge pupils to attend. Dave also focused on the importance of passing Maths and English at school so pupils can really focus on their chosen subjects when they arrive at college. Pupils who do not attain a minimum of a Grade 4 in Maths or English will resit it at college. Dave also spoke with passion about apprenticeships - the opportunity to learn while you earn and the importance of being proactive and approaching companies now to secure them. We can't thank Dave enough for coming into OLCHS and providing such expert advice.
