

Christmas Challenge 2025

The Government Communications Headquarters (GCHQ) is one of the UK's intelligence and security agencies. At GCHQ, people use cutting-edge technology to identify, analyse and disrupt threats to the UK.

Their work covers a wide range of missions, including counterterrorism, serious and organised crime, cyber security, defence, supporting the NHS, and protecting the nation's economic resilience. In short, they help keep the country — and its people — safe.

So, what is the Christmas Challenge?

Each year GCHQ releases a free festive puzzle pack created by its own codebreakers. The Challenge contains a set of clever logic, maths, pattern-spotting and code-breaking puzzles. They're designed especially for young people (roughly ages 11–18), but anyone can have a go. The puzzles are best tackled as a team, encouraging different ways of thinking and perseverance — just like real problem-solving at GCHQ. The 2025 Challenge goes live on **Wednesday 10 December** and can be downloaded from the GCHQ website.

Parents, staff and pupils are invited to take part in this year's GCHQ Christmas Challenge. Good luck!

YEAR 7 & 8



Year 7 and Year 8 hosted Fulwood on Thursday in a strong afternoon of fixtures. Both teams started confidently and created chances, though goals proved hard to come by in the first half. Year 7 went into the break with a narrow three-goal advantage, while Year 8 held a two-goal lead.

Persistence paid off in the second half. Year 7 extended their dominance to secure an impressive 7–0 victory, and Year 8 maintained control to finish 4–0 winners. Players of the match were Emily S for Year 7 and Amber L for Year 8, both showing excellent composure and accurate shooting under pressure.

The U16 girls battled through blustery conditions to secure an impressive 4–0 victory against Lostock Hall, despite a slow start that saw them struggling to find their rhythm. Strong winds disrupted early passing play, but the team gradually settled, growing in confidence as the match progressed.

Goalkeeper Evie remained composed throughout, making smart decisions and helping the defence maintain a well-earned clean sheet. At the other end of the pitch, Karley R delivered a standout performance, netting an outstanding hat-trick and causing constant problems for the opposition back line. The fourth goal came from sustained team pressure, reflecting the squad's determination to overcome the elements and take full control of the game.

By the final whistle, the team's perseverance, discipline, and improved link-up play shone through.

A 4-0 win in tough conditions is a testament to their hard work and growing cohesion. An excellent result to build on for the remainder of the season.
